

HOW TO HIRE AND SCREEN A HOME CARE PROVIDER

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Elder Abuse – "The Crime of the 21st Century."

- Be aware that with elders alone at home, it can be a crime of opportunity for the home-care worker.
- Consider the people who enter the elder's home freely and work long hours are UNSUPERVISED.
- We need a conscious effort to protect our elders at home.

Four Types of Home Care Companies

- □ **Employers**: Employees are hired and paid directly by home care agency.
 - Covered by workers comp. and liability laws.
 - □ Home care agency is responsible for federal tax, Social Security, and Medicare withholding, and state / local income taxes.
 - Usually bonded and insured.
 - Background checked, drug tested, supervised, and trained.
 - Back-up caregivers are available if needed.

Four Types of Home Care Companies Continued.

- □ **Registries**: Companies that coordinate the scheduling of caregivers.
 - Paid as independent contractors.
 - □ Caregivers responsible for own taxes.
 - Liability insurance is covered by the homeowner /elder.
 - If caregiver considered an employee, then elder is responsible withholding taxes, SS, and Medicare.
 - Ask about background checks, drug testing, supervision, and training.
 - Consult an attorney / accountant.

Four Types of Home Care Companies Continued.

- □ **Referral Services**: Referral and background screenings typically provided for a fee.
 - Elder / family becomes the legal employer.
 - Federal ID must be acquired and obligation to pay federal withholding, Medicare, state and local taxes, and employer matches.
 - In some cases workers comp. required, family medical leave, and other state labor industry practices.
 - No supervision, drug testing, training.
 - Consult an attorney and accountant.

Four Types of Home Care Companies Continued.

- Independent Caregiver: Individuals who sell their services as caregivers.
 - Typically place ad in the paper or online.
 - Elder / family responsible for tax withholding, workers compensation, unemployment compensation, liability insurance.
 - No background check, drug test, supervision, or training.
 - Consult an attorney and accountant.

Types of Personal Care

- Companion Care: Meal prep., light housekeeping, assistance with daily activities such as letter writing, reading, and entertainment. Caregiver generally does not touch the client.
- Personal Care: Helping with ADL's: Eating, bathing, dressing, toileting, transferring, and continence.
 Hands-on care.
- Skilled Care: Licensed professional such as RN,
 LPN, PT, or OT. Covered by Medicare, Medicaid,
 and private insurance.

Getting Started...

- Call local Ombudsman office to see if there are any complaints against specific agencies.

Good Steps to Take

- □ Create a list of care needs-
 - □ Include your expectation of how those needs will be met.
- □ Ask for recommendations-
 - Friends, family, support group members, church, health care providers, Angie's List
- □ Interview at home-
 - Prepare your questions beforehand
 - □ Include a third person present / discuss impressions
- □ Check references!

Questions to Ask a Care Provider:

- □ Questions to ask an Agency
 - How long in business?
 - How is agency licensed or accredited?
 - Are the employees bonded and insured?
 - Does agency offer a RN visit prior to start of service?
 - Describe quality control.
 - What happens if the aid doesn't show?
 - Minimum hours / days required?
 - □ Is there 24 hour care in case of emergency?
 - Cost? Additional cost for weekend / holiday?

Questions to Ask a Care Provider:

- Questions to ask an Agency continued:
 - What kind of criminal background tests performed?
 - □ Drug testing?
 - Are references checked? How many?
 - Are personnel files updated annually?
 - What kind of experience / certification do aids have before they are hired?
 - Describe your staff training.
 - Who pays workers SS and other insurances?
 - Is there a care plan in writing for each client?
 - Will the same person be providing care on a regular basis?
 - □ Can I interview the employee?

Questions to Ask a Care Provider:

- Questions to ask the individual care provider:
 - How long have you been working in this field?
 - Describe your experience working with seniors.
 - Are you specifically trained in dementia care?
 - Are you trained in CPR and first aid?
 - Are you bonded? Drug tested? Carry liability insurance?
 - Will you pay your own taxes?
 - □ References?
 - Do you have a background check?
 - What is your back up plan in case you are sick?
 - Do you have your own transportation?

Conclusion:

- □ Criminal background checks only show
 CONVICTIONS not complaints or arrests.
- □ Check local sex offender registries.
- □ ICHAT searches for convictions in Michigan only.
- □ Nanny cam?
- □ Un-announced visits?
- ☐ Hide cash, checkbooks, credit cards and all other personal information (SS#, Medicare #)
